I am pleased to be able to offer the PFA's support for the Bill.

We have specifically liaised with the Australian Federal Police who have outlined any potential impact on the AFP and in turn our members.

We note, it will be important that there is an appropriate protocol for the role of the AFP in any such circumstances where a serious criminal offence may be reported under the Act, including protocols around the ability to share any appropriate disclosed information. We have been further advised that as a result of the Bill, the AFP will review and update its own guidance and procedures for dealing with Public Interest Disclosures within its agency.

We further note and support the comments in the Australian Federal Police submission in relation to proposed amendments to sections 285, 287 and 300 of the *Telecommunications Act 1997*. Any amendments that will assist police in minimizing the threat of serious injury or death to a missing person should be expedited.
