## Submission in lieu of an Opening Statement to the Committee

Please refer to my submission of the 6<sup>th</sup> September 2019 to the Senate Standing Committee on Community Affairs.

The points that I would like to reiterate and update the Committee on are:

- 1. The suitability of ANZARD to report clinic-specific success rates including existing infrastructure and ANZARD data items.
- 2. The expertise and independence of the NPESU to undertake this task.
- 3. Recommend that the RTAC Code of Practice be amended to specify that data submitted to ANZARD will be used to clinic-specific success rates.
- 1. Essential data consistency with the "Online IVF Patient Predictor" tool, RTAC benchmarking reports, ANZARD Annual Report.
- 2. NPESU recently awarded Data Custodianship and management of the "World IVF Registry" for the next 5 years.
- 3. Medical Research Future Fund (MRFF) into Causes and Prevention of Male infertility is centred on ANZARD;
  - i. "Online IVF Patient Predictor"
  - ii. Large ANZARD data-linkage study
  - iii. ANZARD Clinical trials data portal
- 4. Progress on reporting clinic-specific success rates:
  - a. Working Party has reached consensus on 5 key measures (stratified by age) of clinic success rates for public reporting.
  - b. Engaged with 3 health-data communications companies to design, test and implement a consumer-friendly website.
  - c. Possible delivery of a central website within 6 months.
