Hi,

Just wanted to make sure you had clarity on one issue in relation to current EU and UK regulations

The current European law states that <u>worked</u> ivory originally acquired before 1947 can be traded without restriction in the EU and the UK. Worked ivory produced between 1947 and 1990 can only be traded with a government-issued Article 10 certificate issued by the CITES management authority, and ivory newer than 1990 is completely banned.

Unworked ivory (tusks, horns etc) has been banned in the UK since 2012 and no trade within the UK or for export is allowed.
