## **Tasmania: the Antarctic Gateway**

Tasmania's role as an Antarctic Gateway and the Australian Antarctic Division's role in leading and coordinating the Australian Antarctic Program will be the focus of a public hearing of a parliamentary inquiry into Australia's Antarctic Territory on Friday 10 November in Hobart.

The Joint Standing Committee on the National Capital and External Territories will hear from the Australian Antarctic Division about the future direction and needs of the Australian Antarctic Program. The hearing will also provide the Committee with an opportunity to gather evidence from a range of Hobart based businesses, Government departments, research organisations and Antarctic experts such as Dr Tony Press on the contribution Tasmania makes to Antarctic sector.

Committee Chair, Mr Ben Morton MP, noted that "as the home of the Australian Antarctic Division and a broad range of shipping and aviation infrastructure, logistical support services, and scientific expertise that service both Australian and international Antarctic programs, Hobart plays a special role in the Australian Antarctic Program."

Mr Morton said, "Friday's public hearing will provide the Committee with an opportunity to better understand how organisations within Hobart can better support both the scientific and logistical requirements of the Antarctic Program, while providing Tasmania with significant economic opportunities."
