**COMMUNITY CONSULTATION REPORT
DEFENCE FUEL TRANSFORMATION PROGRAM – TRANCHE 2 FACILITIES
PROJECT**

1. The Defence Fuel Transformation Program – Tranche 2 Facilities Project (the Project) was referred to the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works on 12 September 2023. The Project proposes to deliver facilities and infrastructure at 10 sites across Australia.

- a. Garden Island Defence Precinct (GIDP), New South Wales;
- b. RAAF Base Learmonth, Western Australia;
- c. Australian Defence Satellite Communications Station (ADSCS) Geraldton, Western Australia;
- d. Jindalee Operational Radar Network (JORN), Laverton, Western Australia;
- e. Jindalee Operational Radar Network (JORN), Longreach, Queensland;
- f. Lavarack Barracks, Queensland;
- g. Borneo Barracks, Cabarlah, Queensland;
- h. Puckapunyal Military Area, Victoria;
- i. Army Testing Grounds (ATG) Monegeetta, Victoria; and
- j. Joint Proof and Experimental Unit (JPEU) Port Wakefield, South Australia.

2. This letter is to inform the Committee of the nature and extent of community consultation that has been undertaken by the Department of Defence for these proposed works. The aim of the consultation is to ensure local communities and other stakeholders are:

- a. well informed about the Project details through effective and proven communication channels; and
- b. provided the opportunity to raise any concerns or issues, or to seek further information so that, wherever feasible, Defence can address these within the Project.

3. The following stakeholder and community consultation activities have been delivered in accordance with the Project’s comprehensive Community and Stakeholder Engagement Plan:

- a. establishing a Project email address to receive submissions and questions about the Project – these details are included in the example shown at **Annex A**;
- b. updating the Defence website with details about the community information sessions – these details are included in the screenshot at **Annex A**;
- c. advertising community information sessions in relevant local newspapers in Learmonth, Kojarena, Laverton, Puckapunyal, Monegetta, Townsville (Murray), Cabarlah, Longreach, Port Wakefield and Sydney – these details are included in the example advertisement shown at **Annex A**;
- d. conducting three community information sessions via MS Teams for Western Australia, South Australia and Victoria (combined) on 4 October 2023, and Queensland on 5 October 2023; and
- e. organising a Public Consultation Drop-in session for New South Wales at the Holiday Inn, Potts Point on 9 October 2023.

The type of information Defence presented to the public at the Virtual sessions and Drop-in session is shown at **Annex B**, and the level of attendance is provided at **Annex C**.

- f. inviting key stakeholders, including Federal, State and Local Members of Government, and local community and business groups, to receive a personal briefing about the Project – an example of the invitation that was sent is at **Annex D**.
4. A list of all stakeholders engaged by the Project, including the status of each engagement, is provided at **Annex E**. A summary of topics and key issues raised during community information sessions is provided at **Annex F**.
 5. Information about the proposed works was generally well received at the community information sessions and feedback to date has been supportive. Defence has not been made aware of any objections to the proposed works. One Confidential submission and one submission from City of Sydney dated 12 October 2023 have been lodged with the Committee. A letter of offer for an additional online briefing prior to the PWC Hearing has been sent to the City of Sydney.
 6. Comments raised by members of the community were mainly focused on:
 - a. gaining more insight about the Project and comprehending the potential impacts related to noise, visual elements and access; and
 - b. the Project need and the selection of the 10 sites.
 7. Consultation activities have concluded. Defence will provide a briefing to Federal, State and Local Members of Government contacted during the consultation process should they request one.



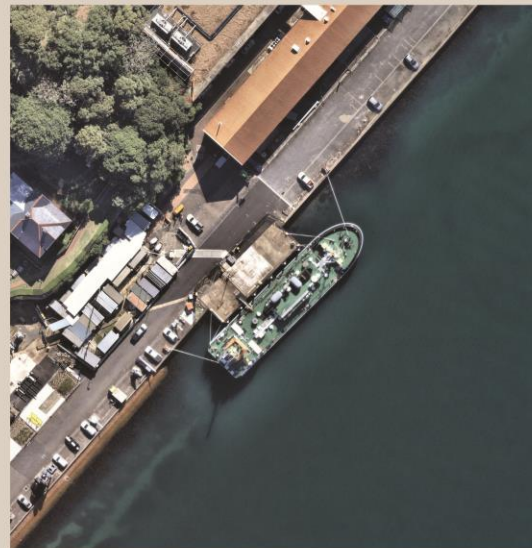


Figure 3: Current northeast wharf at the Garden Island Defence Precinct

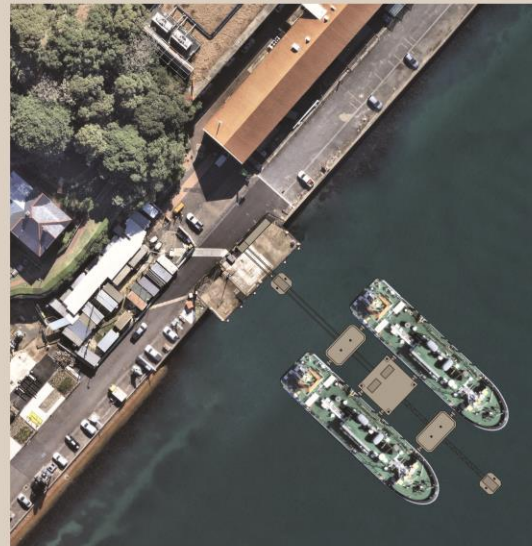


Figure 4: Proposed new northeast wharf at the Garden Island Defence Precinct



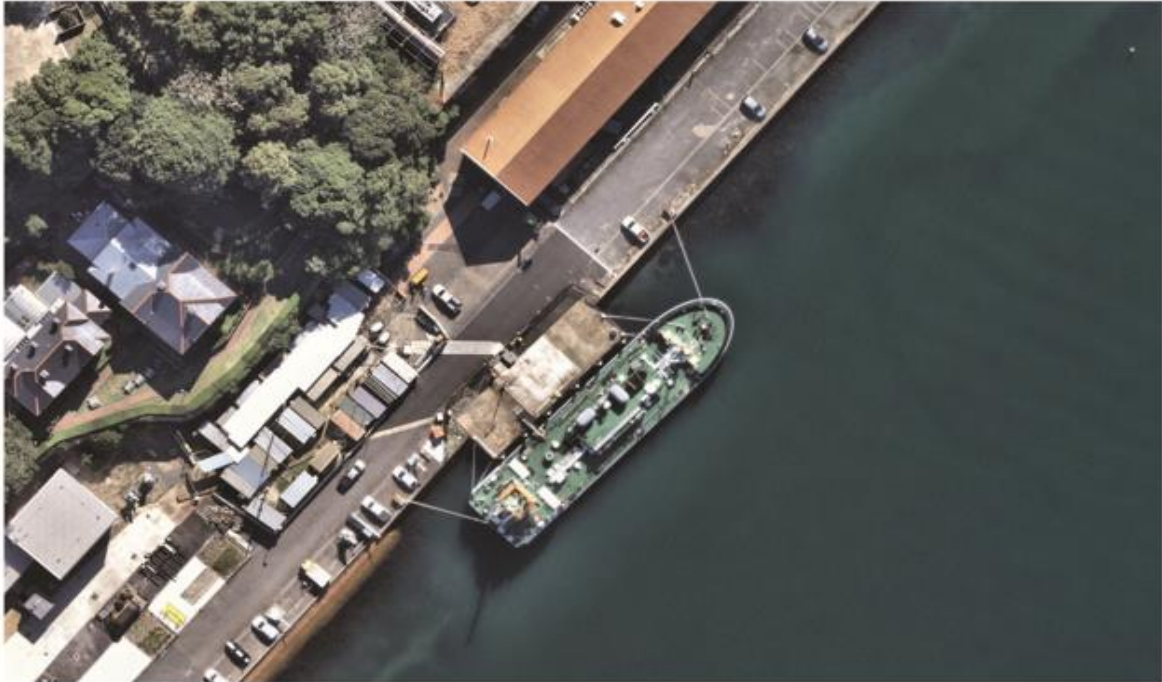


Figure 3: Current northeast wharf at the Garden Island Defence Precinct

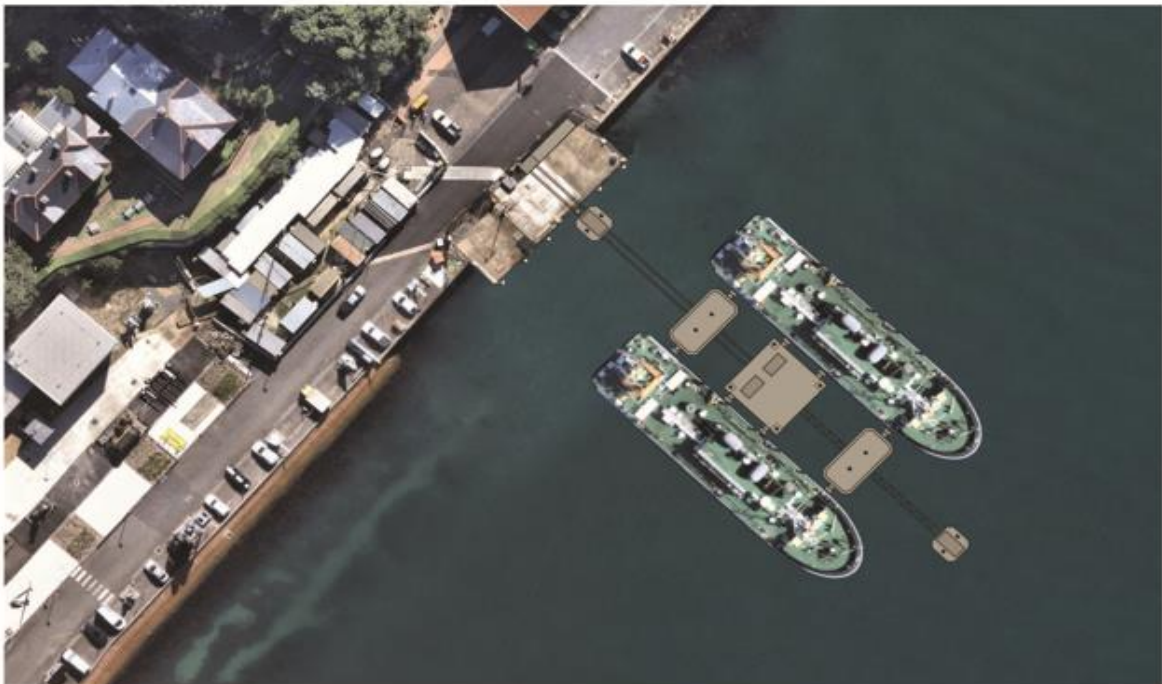


Figure 4: Proposed new northeast wharf at the Garden Island Defence Precinct

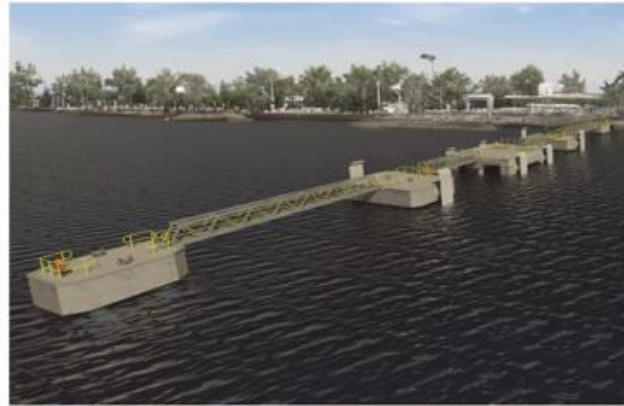
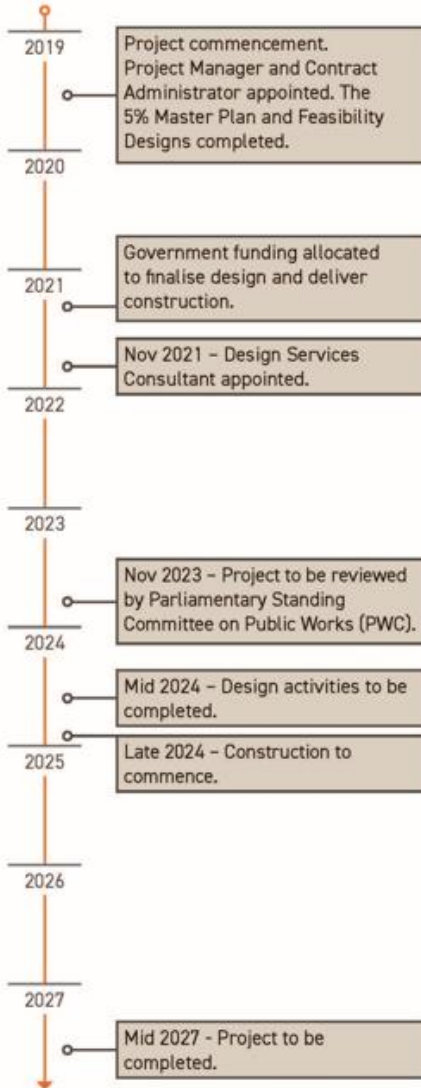


Figure 5: Proposed new wharf – northern view

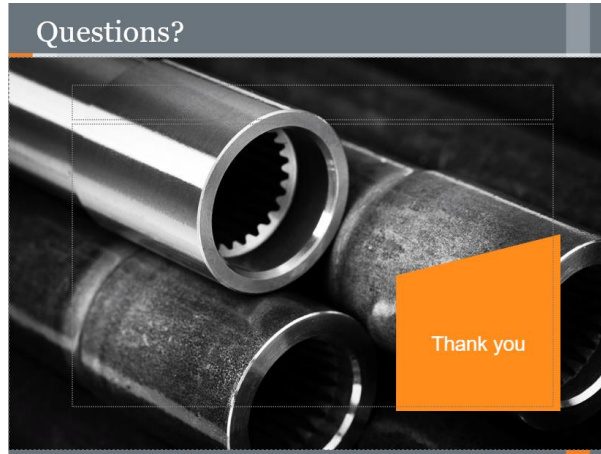

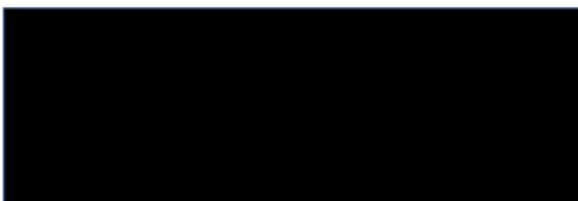

1. On behalf of the Department of Defence, I am writing to inform you of proposed works in your electorate at the Garden Island Defence Precinct as part of the Defence Fuel Transformation Project, Tranche 2 (the Project). The Project was referred to the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works in September 2023.
2. The Project aims to systematically assess in-scope Defence Fuel Installations (DFI) and provide informed recommendations for the remediation, replacement, upgrade and/or disposal of existing assets across various sites.
3. The estimated cost of the entire Project is \$286.9 million, which includes a minimum of eleven sites around the country including the Garden Island Defence Precinct. The value of works within the electorate is estimated to be in the range of \$30.32 to \$41.02 million.
4. A Parliamentary hearing is scheduled for October 2023, and construction work is proposed to occur through 2024 - 2026.
