Regarding a deputation because of the hardship when our property was inspected for land clearing because of the loss of Pastures from the Greyfriars River Watercourse 90 K's West of Murre (After Copeton Dam). Prior to Sept<sup>th</sup> King Law that we as freehold land owners could no longer have the right to use our country how we wish.

I have my maps of areas that have a total Bar of 2,000 acres of land ready to be introduced into the Farming Business and hence where clearing could not take place turned my paddocks into patch work unmanageable areas, as you can not successfully farm + graze in the same paddocks.

My dealings were with the then Water Commission in Murre NSW.

This has caused hardship to the family Business and we wish to apply to be compensated for the lost income and more so now, because of the sale of land, we have reached retirement age and found out that our land is rejected because our applications to improve the Property in 1995-1996 was rejected and we can not get sufficient interest because of this - so we feel we need to be compensated because we obeyed the Rules after our inspection.
