Public Governance, Performance and Accountability Amendment (Vaccine Indemnity) Bill 2023

I strongly support this bill by Senator Ralph Babet that there should be no indemnity for vaccine manufacturers to escape liability if their drugs harm the population.

If they know they are liable for prosecution, then hopefully, we can be reassured that proper testing for safety has occurred.

Public safety

The manufacture of medications or vaccines for emergency use or non-urgent prescribing should involve thorough testing to ensure that they are safe for all ages and safe for pregnant and breastfeeding mothers and also safe for people with co-morbidities. They need to be checked that they are not detrimental to reproductive health (male and female) and have no cancer risk.

All RMNA vaccines need to be studied for the risk of altering DNA by independent DNA specialists.

Risk versus benefit.

There should be trials with the vaccinated versus unvaccinated populations for over at least 6 months to pick up adverse reactions to the vaccine versus the risk of severe COVID requiring hospitalization.

Reporting of vaccine adverse reactions needs to be mandatory, not voluntary. With severe penalties for medical personnel who fail to report any incident requiring medical intervention, even if unsure if connected to the vaccine as this is an ongoing trial with limited testing of the vaccine pre role out... (a car crash may be caused by a medical episode associated with the vaccine!)

Financial gain.

All drugs should be independently tested, not by the manufacturer who stands to gain financially from their acceptance by the TGA.

An independent panel of medical experts in the Immunology and vaccine field needs to make decisions on if there is a medical need for ongoing boosters.
