I am a casual employee, working as a tutor, currently earning around \$40 per hour.

I have a mortgage.

More importantly I believe in weekends.

What do you have in mind calling Saturday and Sunday if they are not different from the other days in the week?

If people want service on a Saturday or Sunday they should pay more for it and the employees in that shop, cafe, pub etc etc get paid more.

Will you have schools going onto Saturday and Sunday too?

Parents and grandparents would like to spend some time with their families and if they

cannot because of work requirements then they should be compensated for that inconvenience.
