Submission to the Inquiry into the Fair Work Amendment (Small Business-Penalty Rates Exemption) Bill 2012

I am a permanent employee, working as a cook, currently earning around \$30 per hour.

I am a chef and have been working in the service industry for 30 plus years. In doing so a large part of my income has been based on penalty rates.

If penalty rates were abolished... It would amount to a 20 to 30% cut to many people in my industry's income which gives a lot less money to be circulated through the economy and leads to hardship and problems for the many while leaving the money in the hands of a smaller group of people. The employers.

My weekends are important to me because... This cheap weekend labour will also lead to more people being made to work weekends. As manager for the kids netball team it

is hard enough to get parent help for weekend sports and the surf club as it is. I feel changes like this are an attack on the Australian way of life with everyone at work and not enough people left to run the social and sporting activities we all enjoy on the weekend.
