



## A legal perspective on tax disputes

A Deputy President of the Administrative Appeals Tribunal and two law firms will present evidence at a public hearing on Thursday in Brisbane.

The hearing is part of an inquiry into tax disputes by the House of Representatives Standing Committee on Tax and Revenue.

The Committee will also meet with a private individual, Mr Grahame Pilgrim, to discuss his experience being involved in a dispute with the ATO.

Committee Chair John Alexander MP said:

“The general focus of this public hearing will be to get the perspective of legal practitioners on the disputes process.”

“Given his previous career as a barrister, Deputy President Hack of the Administrative Appeals Tribunal will also be able to provide the Committee with a longer term overview of the way tax disputes are litigated.”
