

Jeffrey L. Derevensky, PhD, is Professor and Director of Clinical Training in School/Applied Child Psychology, Department of Educational and Counselling Psychology; and Professor, Department of Psychiatry at McGill University. He is a clinical consultant to numerous hospitals, school boards, government agencies and corporations. He has published widely in the fields of child development, developmental psychopathology, gambling studies and education. As well, he is on the editorial board of numerous journals. Since 1992 he has been investigating youth gambling problems and has developed a comprehensive research program investigating many facets of youth gambling, is actively involved in treating youth with severe gambling problems, helps coordinate multiple prevention initiatives, and is the Co-Director of the McGill University Youth Gambling Research and Treatment Clinic and the International Centre for Youth Gambling Problems and High-Risk Behaviors. He is a member of international scientific committees and has been the recipient of numerous research and training grants. Much of his work has focused on furthering our understanding of youth gambling problems and high-risk behaviors. He has provided expert testimony before numerous governmental commissions, has over 140 published refereed journal articles, numerous book chapters and research reports. He was the recipient of the Connecticut Council on Problem Gambling Award for his “International leadership in addressing youth problem gambling through research, training and advocacy” and the International Centre for Youth Gambling Problems and High-Risk Behaviors was the recipient of the U.S. National Council on Problem Gambling Outstanding Program Award.
