

Marriage

BACKGROUND

Marriage is an institution of the Church. That is its origin and continues to be a strong institution of the church. In some churches, Marriage is of such a high order that it is deemed to be a Sacrament.

Most of today's laws have stemmed from the Jewish-Christian history and have been absorbed into society with very little realisation as to their origin and that is fine – it is a gift from God to our society.
