Law, justice and economic development of women and girls

Women's economic development, law and justice and the effectiveness of Australian Aid programs are all on the agenda for a public hearing, to be conducted as part of the parliamentary inquiry into the human rights issues confronting women and girls in the Indian Ocean-Asia Pacific region.

The Human Rights sub-committee of the Joint Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade will hold two days of hearings in Canberra on 6 and 7 May.

Witnesses scheduled to participate include:

- Dr Jeni Klugman, a fellow at the Kennedy School of Government's Women in Public Policy Program at Harvard University (formerly Director of Gender and Development at the World Bank Group);
- The Hon Diana Bryant AO, Chief Justice of the Family Court of Australia; and
- the former Chief Justice of the Family Court of Australia, the Hon Alastair Nicholson AO RFD QC.

Other witnesses include the Secretariat of the Pacific Community, Dr Anke Hoeffler from the Centre for the Study of African Economies, Oxford University and other expert witnesses who will address issues including:

- Violence and conflict
- Forced work and Slavery
- Microfinance
- Children and legal rights
