- 24. In its submission, DSS provided evidence of consultations with the community regarding 'service provision through a transition scheme. Were respondents asked about the services they require access to generally, without being tied to the coercive element of compulsory income management?
- a. Can you please provide a copy of the questions being used in the consultations, describe the format of these questionnaires, and explain how participants are recruited?
- b. Were people given the option of completely voluntary programs and having no IM at all, having properly funded public services untied to people's mechanisms of survival, like the rest of the people of this country enjoy?
- c. Were alternatives to income management the subject of consultations with community considering they know best what they need, and what will work?
- d. What are you doing to empower First Nations communities to conduct their own research and community-led consultations and decision making about how services should be delivered independent of government, in line with the top priorities of the Closing the Gap agreement?
