I want to be clear that just because submitters and witnesses express support for broader access to vaping, or it being legally available as a commercial product, does not necessarily mean they are in receipt of financial or other support from companies that have a financial interest in the sale of tobacco or vaping products. Those submitters and witnesses who are in receipt of this kind of support should also have their arguments considered on their merits. However, it is in the interests of transparency that declarations about financial or in-kind support are requested.
