Violence against children on agenda for human rights inquiry

UNICEF representatives will discuss human rights issues affecting children around the world at an upcoming public hearing for a parliamentary inquiry.

The Human Rights Sub-Committee of the Joint Committee on Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade is inquiring into human rights issues confronting women and girls in the Indian Ocean – Asia-Pacific region.

Representatives from the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) will appear at a public hearing of the Sub-Committee on 30 September 2014.

UNICEF works in over 150 countries and territories to provide emergency relief and longer term development projects for children.

Earlier this month UNICEF released *Hidden in Plain Sight: A Statistical analysis of violence against children,* which it describes as the world's largest-ever study on violence against children.

The report collates and reviews data from 190 countries to shed light on issues including child homicide, violence against children within families and by peers, and attitudes towards sexual violence.

It also provides evidence that violence against children is prevalent around the world and more common than previously recognised. The report makes recommendations on strategies aimed at protecting children from violence.
