The person with the 457 visa is paid separately by RWWA for every ride he participates in \$125 per race plus 5% of the stake if he wins and is required to provide his own insurance. This money has nothing to do with the sponsor Albany Chaff. Obviously it is important for to field as many races as he can in terms of keeping up his fitness levels and skills.

Not by myself.( is also paid 5% of all stake moneys earned by any horses he rides in a race.  
It is important for any jockey to ride as many horses as possible in a race situation in order to keep  
His fitness level and riding skills tuned to the highest level so as to remain competitive
