### Questions from Hansard – Mr Ian Brightwell, private citizen

1.	<p><b>Senator PATRICK</b> Hansard, p. 8.</p>	<p><b>Senator PATRICK:</b> And, in some sense, that's what I'm leading to. I know that, for example, in health care in Sweden, where they publish the success rates of operations and the performance of positions, they end up getting better results. I wonder if there's not a set of metrics that you could think of—maybe on notice—that you would say, 'This is an absolute minimum.'</p> <p><b>Mr Brightwell:</b> Look at the Queensland website and you've got them all. Their dashboard is excellent.</p> <p><b>Senator PATRICK:</b> So they have a dashboard.</p> <p><b>Mr Brightwell:</b> It's a dashboard; it's excellent.</p> <p><b>Senator PATRICK:</b> I'm with you on that. Thank you very much for informing the committee.</p>
2.	<p><b>Senator PATRICK</b> Hansard, p. 10.</p>	<p><b>Senator PATRICK:</b> The FOIs that you did, are they on a disclosure log somewhere?</p> <p><b>Mr Brightwell:</b> AEC has got them. It was about the Senate scanning. It was just there testing reports.</p> <p><b>Senator PATRICK:</b> So we can get access to them?</p> <p><b>Mr Brightwell:</b> Sure. The AEC publishes all of their FOIs.</p>
