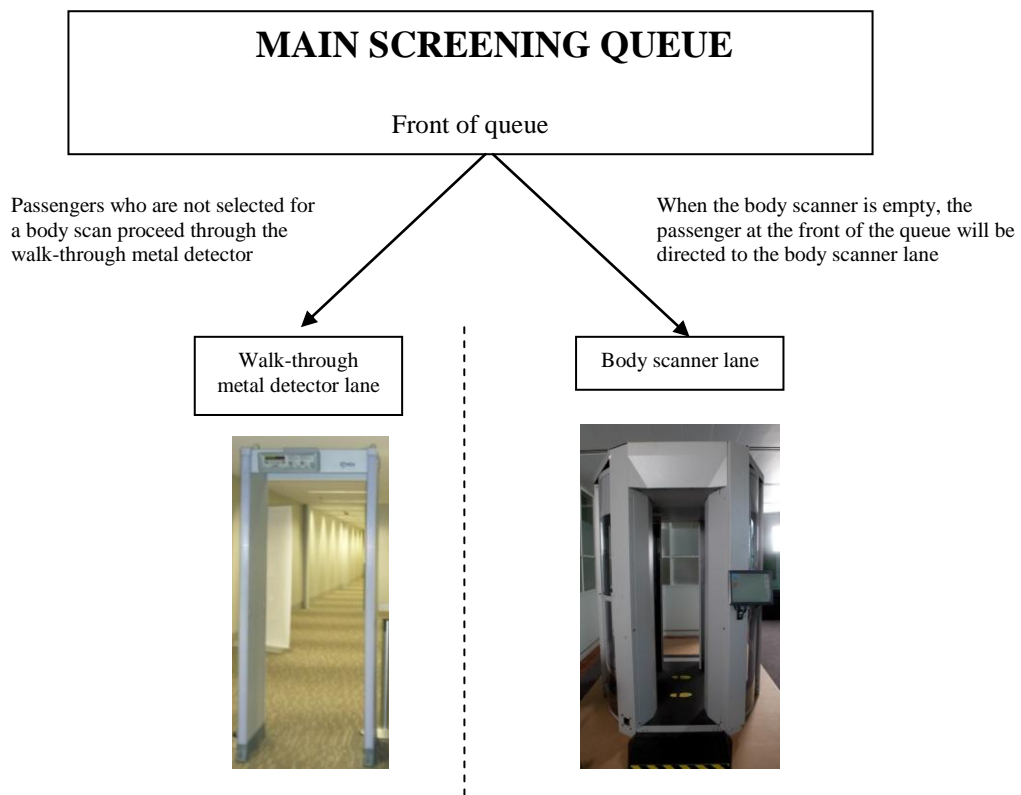


BODY SCANNER SELECTION PROCESS

1. Body scanners will be installed at every second screening lane at Australia's eight international gateway airports, alternating with the existing walk-through metal detectors.
2. They will be used as a primary method of screening. This means that a passenger will have to go through either the body scanner or the walk-through metal detector, but not both.
3. Passengers will be **randomly** selected from the head of the main screening queue and directed to a lane with a body scanner. No profiling or targeting will take place and every passenger has an equal chance of being selected.



4. If a passenger is selected for body scanning, they cannot choose to go through the walk-through metal detector, instead they must undergo a body scan or they will not be allowed to board their flight. The only exceptions will be those passengers who are physically unable to undergo a body scan.
