**SELECT COMMITTEE ON FOREIGN INTERFERENCE THROUGH

**MEDIA RELEASE**

**28 July 2020**

The Senate's [Select Committee on Foreign Interference through Social Media](#) will be holding two public hearings to inquire into the risk posed to Australia's democracy by foreign interference through social media, with particular reference to:

- a. use of social media for purposes that undermine Australia's democracy and values, including the spread of misinformation;
- b. responses to mitigate the risk posed to Australia's democracy and values, including by the Australian Government and social media platforms;
- c. international policy responses to cyber-enabled foreign interference and misinformation;
- d. the extent of compliance with Australian laws; and
- e. any related matters.

The first public hearing is scheduled for **Friday, 21 August 2020**.<sup>\*</sup> This hearing will feature international and domestic experts. The Committee has also invited representatives from TikTok Australia to appear.

The second public hearing will occur in **September 2020**. The Committee has invited representatives from Facebook, Twitter, Google and WeChat to appear.

The Committee will be reporting in March 2022 and anticipates holding a number of further hearings before then. Information about those hearings will be made available in the usual course.
