My weekends are important to me because we have always taken every opportunity to support our children and grand children in their sports and hobbies. Work commitments usually prevonly allow us weekends to attend these events.

I urge the committee to keep penalty rates. The industries that are being considered in this reform generally pay a low income. The workers are required to work awkward hours to provide service at nights and weekends. The penalty rates that these times draw are essential to provide enough income to meet normal financial commitments.
