



Federal election inquiry public hearings continue

The Joint Standing Committee on Electoral Matters will continue its programme of public hearings on matters related to the 2013 Federal election over the next three days.

Today, the Committee will receive evidence from the ACT Electoral Commissioner and the Department of Communications on the subject of electronic voting.

Tomorrow, the Committee will hear from the Palmer United Party and the Greens, as well as a number of party scrutineers who observed the Western Australian Senate elections.

The AEC will appear on Thursday to respond to any major issues raised by the parties as well as a number of issues raised during the course of the inquiry.
