# Senate committee will consider current and proposed sexual consent laws in Australia

On 29 November 2022, the Senate referred an inquiry into current and proposed sexual consent laws in Australia to the Senate Legal and Constitutional Affairs References Committee for inquiry and report by 30 June 2023.

The committee will consider:

- inconsistencies in consent laws across different Australian jurisdictions;
- the operation of consent laws in each jurisdiction;
- any benefits of national harmonisation;
- how consent laws impact survivor experience of the justice system;
- the efficacy of jury directions about consent;
- impact of consent laws on consent education; and
- the findings of any relevant state or territory law reform commission review or other inquiry.

In addition to the terms of reference, the committee intends to publish a discussion paper to guide submitters in the New Year.
