



## **Submission to local power agency bill**

I write to express reservations about the serious inefficiencies inherent in the renewable generators which are promoted uncritically across the media.

If wind and solar are free, why are they making us pay? The debut of ALPA won't make the price of power come down. Quite the contrary. All we're being offered in exchange for the higher power price is vague promises of better weather in 100 years' time. The only realistic projection is Earth's temperature 100 years hence will be slightly hotter, slightly cooler or much the same.

The inefficient use of resources is a real existential threat, just ask the Soviets, or an honest economist.

No specific mention of hydro power is made in the preamble to the Bill, yet it's probably the sole worthwhile renewable power generation in Dr Haines electorate. I know of small scale hydro electric cooperatives around the edge of Mt Buffalo. They don't get any fanfare.
