Good morning

The purpose of this email is to provide you with cleared responses to the following **Questions On Notice.** 

National Carillon – information on why do the bells need replacing, do they sound different with age, the cost of the replacement of the bells and what is the planning for the replacement

#### Response:

In 2003 a number of bells were replaced to improve the Carillon's tonal quality. The bells were all cast by the original carillon bellfounders in the United Kingdom. Further replacement of bells is not required at this time.

As part of the on-going maintenance of the Carillon, the National Capital Authority (NCA) is currently assessing the need to upgrade or replace the clappers. The clapper is the part of the carillon that strikes the bell, causing it to sound. They are usually shaped as a ball, made of cast iron or bronze, which is attached to the end of a rod or 'shank' and connected to the clavier. The condition of the clapper can affect the sound quality of the bells.

The NCA is currently scoping this project and does not have a project cost for upgrading or replacing the clappers, if this is determined to be required.

**Parking** – provision of overflow parking in the Parliamentary Triangle.

#### **Response:**

West Block car park is utilised by Department of Parliamentary Services (DPS) during parliament sitting periods as an overflow car park. A boom gate is operational and controlled by DPS during this period. There is a supply of 396 parking spaces in West Block car park. DPS Security monitor this car

park twice a day during sitting periods and monitor numbers (see attached). Utilisation has been increasing and during days where both houses, occupancy is up to 160 cars per day. Feedback from DPS is that this arrangement under an Memorandum of Understanding has been successful.
