How small business can provide opportunity for all jobseekers

Organisations which help jobseekers in need will give evidence at a public hearing in Parramatta tomorrow as part of an inquiry into small business employment.

Witnesses at the Education and Employment Committee hearing include:

- two social enterprises that assist homeless youth through on the job training in areas such as cafes, a car wash and a bookstore,
- an organisation that prepares women for the workforce and outfits them for interviews,
- the Deaf Society of NSW and local mental health teams,
- organisations assisting Indigenous people to get employment, and,
- groups, including the Lebanese Muslim Association, which represent people from ethnic and migrant backgrounds

Mr Andrew Laming MP, Committee Chair, said that everyone deserves fair and equal opportunity to gain employment and it's important to find out how to make this a reality for all.

"It doesn't matter who you are, what your background is or whether you have a disability, it's important that everyone in our community has the opportunity to gain meaningful employment. Small business is our largest employer and the committee is seeking answers as to how these job seekers can tap into the small business network," he said.
