I would like to forward my following request for your kind attention against the new migration amendment.

I arrived in Australia as an International student in 2006 with the hope of completing my studies and becoming a permanent resident in your great country. In order to do so I had to spend an extremely large amount of money and go through great turmoil as international student living alone.

My parents have spent a very large amount of money for my studies and my living expenses. I also spent a lot of time on my studies to complete my degree in order to meet the requirement criteria to apply for the permanent residency in your country. The whole reason for deciding to come and study in Australia was so that I could apply for permanent residency after completing my studies. Since submitting my application I have been patiently waiting for it to be approved for more than a year now.
