Banning the trading of Nazi symbols will be ineffective in curbing hate and extremism but further prove their point . Prohibition alone does not address the underlying causes of these ideologies. Instead, efforts should focus on promoting education, dialogue, and understanding to counteract the appeal of such symbols and ideologies. Furthermore, enforcing a ban on trading can be challenging, especially in the age of the internet, where transactions can occur globally and anonymously.

The symbols and artefacts associated with the Nazi regime hold significant historical value. Scholars, historians, and educators often rely on these items to study and teach about the atrocities committed during World War II and the Holocaust. By banning their trade, we risk limiting access to these materials, potentially hindering our understanding and remembrance of one of the darkest chapters in human history: free speech and banning the trading of Nazi symbols infringes upon individuals' rights to express themselves. While Nazi symbols undoubtedly carry negative connotations, restricting their trade could set a precedent for suppressing other forms of expression that some find offensive but are still protected under the principle of free speech. I feel that this bill is attacking a very small population that uses and promotes this symbol for hatred and us collecting community is at loss.
