Senator REYNOLDS: 33 and 46 were designed to make \$8.4 billion of savings alone in the intraplan inflation. Has the department - when you were writing this legislation, have you ever seen any actuarial data, assumptions, and information in terms of how \$14.5 billion and \$60 billion over the 10 years was going to be realised through this legislation? Have you seen any modelling?

DSS: Yes, Senator, we've had access to the advice that the scheme actually provided to government, both to Department of Finance and other central departments as part of the budget process.

Senator REYNOLDS: Okay. Can I ask you to take on notice and provide for us that modelling?
