I wish to submit the following submission:

The property rights of Australians are being eroded and if vegetation is not allowed to be cleared, then landholders should be well compensated for the reduction of carbon emissions created by industry.

Land still has to be maintained with ongoing control of weeds and feral animals. Weeds can flourish if left uncontrolled, spreading widely and impacting on agricultural production.
