I am writing to support a ban on live animal trade, which is a cruel industry with total disregard to animal welfare. The treatment of livestock is beyond Australia's control and they are at the mercy of inexperienced, incompetent and inadequate handlers and slaughterers. Other countries regard for animal welfare is substandard and if such practises were to occur in Australia then serious penalties would apply.
