Dears sir, madam, These laws penalise those who have preserved trees on their land who now cannot clear those trees for farming grazing or other productive uses. Those who ripped out the trees under then Government encouragement have the benefit of productive use of that land

The Government have taken a benefit and therefore should buy or rent that Affected land.

Some equalisation should be

applied such that those detrimentally affected get a benefit to offset the loss.
