## Examining the protections to freedom of religion or belief

A federal parliamentary committee will examine the legal protections Australia has in place to protect the important human right to freedom of religion or belief at a public hearing this Friday in Canberra.

[The Human Rights Sub-Committee](#) of the Joint Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade will hold the hearing for its inquiry into the status of the human right to freedom of religion or belief.

Sub-Committee Chair [Kevin Andrews MP](#) says the hearing will focus on the legal framework of religious freedom in Australia.

“The Sub-Committee is preparing an interim report which will examine the legal protections Australia has in place to protect the important human right to freedom of religion or belief.

This report will provide a basis upon which the inquiry will progress to examine the other terms of reference.”

- ACT Justice and Community Safety Directorate
- Attorney-General’s Department
- Australian Law Reform Commission
