Question on notice: Inquiry into constitutional reform and referendums

Please find below a response to a question on notice taken by the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) at a public hearing of the Standing Committee on Social Policy and Legal Affairs on 26 October 2021.

Question

With regard to online visits to the AEC for Schools website, Proof Hansard, page 8:

Ms MURPHY: I'm wondering if, on notice, you might be able to provide any of that information you said you had about access to the online resources—how many schools and where, and what sorts of schools, if that's possible?

Mr Rogers: Yes, certainly we'll take that on notice and provide that to the committee.

Response

Demographic information about website visitation is limited. Generally, it is only possible to identify where in the world a computer is connecting to a website by broad jurisdictional category.

For the 2018 to 2021 calendar years, the AEC has data on the total number of visitors and total number of unique visitors to the *AEC for Schools* website. Additional data is available for the 2020 and 2021 calendar years which is indicative of the Australian state or territory a website visitor visited from. It is not possible to capture demographic information about visitors to the website, such as whether they represent a public, private or religious school, or are a teacher, student or member of the public.

AEC for Schools website

The AEC for Schools website (https://education.aec.gov.au/) provides free education resources and programs for teachers and students. This includes information about how to visit the National Electoral Education Centre, education programs such as the recently updated Democracy Rules, a variety of education brochures, factsheets and resources. The website also provides access to the Get Voting program where teachers can order election equipment packs to be sent to their school.
