To whom it may concern

There needs to be an urgent review of the current legislation-to protect the endangered Leadbeaters Possum in Toolangi's State Forest in Victoria.

The bushfires of 2009 destroyed one third of the Toolangi State Forest, and as a local resident, I am shocked to see the amount of logging taking place in these mountains. There seems little regard for the loss of habitat for this critically endangered species and we constantly see very large trees with hollows, carted away on log trucks.

There is no protection within a clear felled coup, and then the explosive fire that follows in the accelerant lit burn off leaves a massive mushroom like smoke cloud destroying even more of the environment and habitant.

This legislation needs to be changed to be quickly responsive to all the threats to our endangered Victorian Flora and Fauna, especially after major events like fire and climate change.
