To the Joint Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade regarding the Inquiry into strengthening Australia's relationships with countries in the Pacific Region,

The Group of 77, consisting of 135 United Nations member states shall hereafter be referred to using the official Australian government term, "Climate Change." The Climate Change poses an existential threat to western hegemony. For a long time Climate Change member states have begged for assistance, fair and reasonable opportunities for economic, social and industrial development. Western nations have responded to these pleas by donating cluster munitions, sponsoring civil war, regime change, drug and people trafficking. Recently on Australia's behalf, materiel sent to Mali, sex tourism in Indonesia, and support of Al-Qaeda affiliated terrorists in Xinjiang. The committee may be familiar with the famous French author, Albert Camus who wrote the book, The Stranger, that attempts to grasp the amoral blasé response of the French Government.

Simiarly, Australia's Foreign policy views pacific nations like the protagonists from, The Collector or Lolita, lasciviously pursuing a vulnerable prize desired but unrequited. Tivalu, light of my life, fire of my loins. My sin, my soul. Tu. Va. Lu. She has come of age now and Australia finds her rejecting our advances and in the arms of another. Did she have a precursor? She did, indeed she did. Stripped naked, we keep Nauru firmly bound, unable to leave, establishing only a detention and military facility reminiscent of an abuser. Australia has constructed its position as completely unethical, domineering and as such any government willing to accept aid from us must actively engage this narrative, spending enormous political capital in the process.
