**PROPOSED RESOLUTION**

Noting that there is no “evidence of compulsory income management having improved the outcomes that it was intending to have an impact upon,” the Central Land Council resolves;

1. To reject the Commonwealth Government proposal to continue compulsory income management to **all** income recipients in the Northern Territory;
2. To endorse the provision of a voluntary income management program enabling income recipients to negotiate quarantined amounts.
3. That the Executive is to be informed on progress of these negotiations and a report provided to the next Council meeting.
