I refer to your letter of 28 April 2009 on behalf of your client, the Cape York Land Council Aboriginal Corporation, concerning the Archer Basin Wild River Declaration 2009, the Lockhart Basin Wild River Declaration 2009 and the Stewart Basin Wild River Declaration 2009 (the Declarations).

On behalf of your client, you request statements of reasons under the *Judicial Review Act 1991* (JRA) in respect of the following decisions:

1 The Governor-in-Council's decision pursuant to section 16 of the Wild Rivers Act 2005 (WRA) to approve the Declarations;

2 My decision pursuant to section 7 of the WRA to make the Declarations; and

3 My predecessor's decision pursuant to section 8 of the WRA to give notices of intent for the Declarations.

I wish to clarify that my decision to make the Declarations was made under section 15, and not section 7, of the WRA. Section 7 concerns the power to declare Wild River areas, whereas section 15 concerns the making of the decision to declare Wild River areas.

I am of the opinion that your client is not entitled to the requested statements of reasons on the basis that the subject decisions are not decisions to which the JRA applies. In particular, I consider:

1 my decision to make the Declarations and the Governor-in-Council's decision to approve the Declarations are decisions of a legislative, rather than administrative, character; and

2 my predecessor's decision to give the notices of intent is merely the initiating step in the process for making the Declarations and does not in any legal or practical sense constitute a substantive decision.

Notwithstanding the above, I am also of the opinion that your client's interests may not be adversely affected by these decisions and that your client therefore is not entitled to the requested statements of reasons on this basis.

Accordingly, I do not propose to provide you with the requested statements.

Nonetheless, I consider it appropriate to provide you with a brief explanation as to why and how the Declarations were made. I note that this information is provided on a without prejudice basis and does not constitute a statement of reasons under the JRA. I do not waive any rights in providing this information.

The purpose of the WRA is to preserve rivers that have all, or almost all, of their natural values intact. Natural values are those environmental processes considered most important to a naturally functioning river system. In order to achieve this purpose, the WRA establishes a framework, that includes the declaration of wild river areas through which particular activities and the taking of natural resources are regulated in order to minimise adverse effects on and preserve the natural values of the rivers and their catchments.

My fundamental reason for making the Declarations is I consider the rivers contained within the Declarations have all, or almost all, of their natural values intact. Having formed this view, I proceeded to prepare and make the Declarations in accordance with the process set out under the WRA. This included:

preparing the proposed declarations;

publishing notices of intent and declaration proposal notices advising as to the availability of the proposed declarations and of the applicable moratoriums;

consulting with the community and stakeholders and receiving written submissions in respect of the proposed declarations;

considering the results of community consultation, including all properly made submissions, concerning the proposed declarations in preparing the final Declarations; and

submitting the Declarations to the Governor-in-Council for approval.

Having regard to the results of the community consultation and written submissions, as well as other matters, I decided to proceed to make the Declarations although with certain changes in order to address issues raised through consultation and in submissions. The Declarations were therefore submitted to the Governor-in-Council for approval and subsequently approved.

Approval by Executive Councillors at Cabinet.

There are two parts to the approval process.

The first part of the approval process involves the submission of Executive Council Minutes to Executive Councillors (i.e. Ministers) for consideration.

Following receipt of Minutes each Tuesday the Executive Council Secretariat prepares a proposed Schedule of Minutes for consideration by Executive Councillors. Copies of the Schedule are provided to the Cabinet Secretariat and these are distributed to each Executive Councillor and each Departmental Chief Executive prior to the Cabinet meeting. No Minutes can be added to the Schedule once it is distributed with the Cabinet bag. If Executive Councillors agree that the matters incorporated in the Schedule should proceed to the Governor in Council, the original Schedule, which is endorsed 'Executive Councillors recommend to Her Excellency the Governor that the Minutes detailed in the accompanying Schedule be approved', is initialled by each Executive Councillor at the regular Cabinet meeting.

Approval by the Governor in Council.

The second part of the approval process is the submission of the Minutes to the Governor in Council for approval. Each Minute is signed by the Governor at a meeting of the Executive Council the following Thursday (see Appendix 1 (.doc, 36 KB)).

After approval, the original Minute cover, together with copies of supporting documents referred to in the Minute, are retained by the Executive Council Secretariat as a permanent record of Executive Council action.



Three more wild river areas to be preserved

xx February 2009

Three wild river areas have been declared in the Stewart, Lockhart and Archer Basins on Cape York Peninsula, Natural Resources and Water Minister Craig Wallace announced today.

"The declaration of these areas covering a total of 18,641 sq km) will ensure that the natural values of the wild rivers in these areas are now better protected for future generations", Mr Wallace said.

Since the proposal to declare these areas was announced in July last year more than 3600 submissions were received and NRW field staff conducted more than 100 consultation meetings across the Cape about the proposals. Each submission, along with matters raised during consultation, was taken into consideration by the Department.

"These wild river areas, which have largely been untouched by development, are a vital part of our natural heritage. They have unique features worth preserving, including free flowing rivers, wetlands, and ecosystems that were found only on Cape fork Peninsula." Mr Wallace said.

Mr Wallace said the declaration of a wild river under the Wild Rivers Act 2005 does not preclude all future development in a wild river area.

"The Cape York community can continue to enjoy the benefits of development with activities such as mining, grazing, fishing, eco-tourism, outstation development and indigenous cultural activities still able to occur," Minister Wallace said.

"These declarations are about ensuring the wild river's natural values are preserved by ensuring that any future development is undertaken responsibly"

"The State Government is committed to protecting the unique biodiversity of our environment, as part of Toward Q2 Vomprrow's Queensland vision," Mr Wallace said.

"Our unique Wild Rivers legislation (the Wild Rivers Act 2005) aims to preserve Queensland's wild rivers for current and future generations of Queenslanders as well as for the rest of the world."

- a) The Chair welcomed members and opened the meeting at 2.35pm.
- b) Apologies
 - Honourable Desley Boyle, MP, Minister for Tourism, Regional Development and Industry

 - · Lyndon Schneiders, The Wilderness Society

The Chair:

- noted that conservation groups have not yet received funding for participation in the CYTRIG process; and
- noted that the funding has been approved and that the Department of Natural Resources and Water (DNRW) would ensure that processing was finalised as a priority.

2. Minutes

CYTRIG

agreed to the adoption of minutes.

3. Report on actions arising from the previous meeting

CYTRIG

 noted the progress achieved on action items from the February 2008 meeting and that these matters will be further considered throughout the agenda.

4. Acquisitions

a) Acquisitions - update

CYTRIG:

- noted the progress to date on priority acquisitions;
- noted that discussions have been held with the Indigenous Land Corporation (ILC) about joint acquisitions;
- agreed that Minister McNamara would discuss funding commitments under ILC with the Commonwealth Minister for Families, Housing, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs (Minister Macklin);
- agreed that applications be submitted for National Reserve System (NRS) funding
 with a key focus on the central and south western areas of Cape York Peninsula
 consistent with the currently endorsed priority acquisition list;
- noted the desire of Indigenous groups to be consulted by the Commonwealth Government before acquisitions under the NRS were progressed.

b) Criteria for inclusion of additional properties on the priority acquisition list

CYTRIG:

- noted that Minister McNamara would seek advice regarding the Queensland Government's ability to acquire properties for outright conversion to Aboriginal land and would write to members with the outcome of this advice;
- requested that the former Premier's commitment in the second reading speech for the Cape York Peninsula Heritage Act regarding the dual role of the acquisition program be fulfilled; and
- agreed to the revised criteria for inclusion of additional properties on the priority acquisition list subject to the above advice.

5. State Land Dealings and National Parks

a) Timelines for completion of State Land Dealing properties for 2008 and update on other properties

CYTRIG:

- noted that in-principle agreement was provided for Running Creek, Lilyvale,
 McIllwraith and Mt Croll land leadings at the meeting of 19 December 2007;
- agreed to the timeframes for completion of the tenure resolution process at Running Creek and Lilyvale; and McIlwraith and Mt Croll;
- · noted the 'State Land Dealings Milestones and Status Report';
- agreed that DNRW would meet with Traditional Owners for the Running Creek property to discuss the wild river proposal for the Stewart River basin;
- noted the Director-General of the Department of the Premier and Cabinet has written to Balkanu and CYLC regarding outstanding invoices for the tenure resolution project, wild rivers initiative and Cape York Peninsula Heritage Act;
- agreed that DNRW and the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) would jointly undertake an analysis of tenure resolution processes to identify opportunities to streamline and consolidate, and provide a report to the next meeting; and
- agreed that DNRW and EPA would prepare an investment plan to identify resources that will be provided by the Queensland Government for properties that have been returned to Traditional Owners and provide a report to the next meeting.
- b) Transferring ownership and joint management of national parks

CYTRIG:

- agreed to the priority order for progressing negotiations on existing national parks;
- noted the priority order is potentially subject to amendment (by further agreement between the Tenure Taskforce and Balkanu) in response to changing Traditional Owner or State interests: and
- noted the report on 'Milestones for conversion of existing national parks to national park (Cape York Peninsula Aboriginal land)'.

c) Status of Indigenous Management Agreement negotiations

CYTRIG:

- noted progress associated with the negotiations of the first Indigenous Management Agreement.
- d) Implementation matters for completed dealings CYTRIG:
 - noted the 'Status Report on Transferred Properties'; and
 - noted the efforts of departmental staff in progressing strategies on-ground including the employment of Indigenous rangers.

6. Other Business

a) Economic development pilot projects

CYTRIG:

- noted progress on pilot native forestry and land use capability projects being progressed by DNRW in partnership with Balkanu and identified Indigenous communities; and
- noted that participating communities will be confirmed by mid June 2008.

b) Wild rivers

CYTRIG:

- noted the proposed consultation program for the wild rivers project on Cape York Peninsula:
- noted that DNRW will discuss with Balkanu a strategy for progressing consultation with Traditional Owners; and
- noted that declaration proposals for the Archer, Stewart and Lockhart river basins will be released in July 2008 with declarations finalised by the end of 2008.
- c) Areas of International Conservation Significance (AICS) update

CYTRIG:

- noted progress towards the assessment, identification and declaration of AICS under the Cape York Peninsula Heritage Act;
- noted links to Commonwealth, World and National Heritage assessment and nomination processes;
- noted the tabling of a letter from the Commonwealth Minister for the Environment, Heritage and the Arts (Minister Garrett) that proposes a tentative listing for Cape York Peninsula by June 2008; and
- noted that Minister McNamara would be meeting with Balkanu, CYLC and ACF in Cairns to discuss the proposed tentative listing.


d) Other business

CYTRIG:

- noted the desire of conservation groups for both the Cape York Peninsula Regional Advisory Committee and Cape York Peninsula Region Scientific and Cultural Advisory Committee to be established as soon as possible;
- noted that letters requesting nominations for the Cape York Peninsula Regional Advisory Committee have been sent to stakeholder groups;
- agreed that Minister McNamara and Minister Wallace would jointly write to Minister Garrett to invite him to attend a future meeting of CYTRIG; and
- agreed that DNRW and EPA would prepare a briefing paper on the work program for Cape York following the 2008-09 budget outcomes and the paper would be circulated to CYTRIG members.

The Chair closed the meeting at 4:40pm.

A wild rivers declaration can aid industries such as organic meat export[RB5], commercial fishing and ecotourism by promoting the wild river areas as a 'clean and green' image and encouraging economic development based on ecosystem services.

The government has undertaken extensive consultation with affected Indigenous communities on Cape York Peninsula and is confident that it has addressed any concerns the Indigenous communities may have had. It was also noted from the consultation that there is significant support for the intent of the Wild Rivers program amongst Indigenous communities on Cape York Peninsula.

The government has developed a Wild River-Ranger-program which employs Indigenous rangers to protect and promote the world class natural values of Queensland's Wild Rivers. To date, as a pilot project, 20 Wild River Rangers have been employed in Cape York Peninsula and across the Gulf of Carpentaria. This provides employment and economic benefits to Indigenous people and communities on the Cape. The government has committed to evaluate the success or otherwise of the 20 positions, prior to a decision for possible expansion of the program with employment of up to 100 rangers, across the State.

The government is confident that future development can occur in a wild river area in such a way that the wild river's natural values are preserved. This ensures the rivers are preserved for all to enjoy, now and in the future.
