COMMUNITY CONSULTATION REPORT FACILITIES TO SUPPORT IMPROVED EMBARKED LOGISTICS SUPPORT HELICOPTER PROJECT

- 1. The Facilities to Support Improved Embarked Logistics Support Helicopter Project was referred to the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works on 20 August 2024. The project proposes to deliver facilities and infrastructure at:
- a. HMAS Albatross, New South Wales; and
- b. HMAS *Stirling*, Western Australia.
- 2. This report is to inform the Committee of the nature and extent of community consultation that has been undertaken by the Department of Defence for the proposed works. The aim of the consultation is to ensure local communities and other stakeholders are:
- a. well informed about the project details through effective and proven communication channels; and
- b. provided the opportunity to raise any concerns or issues, or to seek further information regarding the project so that, wherever feasible, Defence can address these in the proposed works.
- 3. The following stakeholder and community consultation activities have been delivered in accordance with the project's comprehensive community engagement strategy:
- a. Community information sessions were advertised in the Shoalhaven, New South Wales, and Rockingham, Western Australia, regions. Two community information sessions were held at the Fleet Air Arm Museum, Nowra Hill, New South Wales, on 1 August 2024. Details are included in the example advertisement at **Annex A**.
- b. The type of information Defence presented to the public at the community information sessions is shown at **Annex B** and the level of attendance is at **Annex C**.

- c. Key stakeholders, including Federal, State and Local Members of Government, and local community, local Indigenous communities and business groups were invited to receive a personal briefing about the project. An example of the invitation that was sent out is at **Annex D**, and a list of all stakeholders engaged by the project, including the status of each engagement, is at **Annex E**.
- 4. Information about the proposed works was generally well received at the community information sessions and feedback to date has been positive. Defence has not been made aware of any objections to the proposed works.
- 5. Comments raised by members of the community focused on:
- a. existing noise pollution and impact of the project on aerodrome noise;
- b. opportunities for local industry participation in the proposed works;
- c. enquiries about the delivery program;
- d. interest around the helicopter capability and the role it plays in the Royal Australian Navy; and
- e. interest regarding personnel increases to support the project.
- 6. A summary of topics and key issues raised during the community information sessions is at **Annex F**.
- 7. Consultation activities have concluded. Defence will provide briefings to Federal, State and Local Members of Government contacted during the consultation should they request one.



The proposed scope of works at HMAS *Albatross* includes the following elements:


- Permanent operational squadron facilities for 808 Squadron to maintain up to twelve Romeo helicopters and the associated workforce, support equipment and supplies.
- Major civil and infrastructure works to support the integration of the new squadron facilities into the existing Romeo precinct including extension of the existing carpark.
- An extension to the existing Seahawk Simulation and Warfare Centre to house an additional training simulator.

Timeframes

The proposed project is currently in the design phase and progressing through required approvals. The project is likely to be referred to the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works in August 2024 as part of the approvals process. If approved, construction is expected to commence in mid-2025.

The proposed project aims to provide new and upgraded facilities and infrastructure at the Royal Australian Naval Air Station, HMAS *Albatross*.

The works being proposed are to support the integration, operation, and sustainment of twelve additional MH-60R Seahawk (Romeo) helicopters to replace its fleet of six MRH-90 Taipan logistics support helicopters.

The Project will realise the potential of establishing a common maritime helicopter fleet capability by leveraging the existing Romeo capability, training and sustainment frameworks delivered by earlier acquisition projects.
