For Committee members to gain a full understanding of the concerns of Tiwi, it is essential that the Standing Committee come to our Islands and conduct a hearing at Nguiu, on Bathurst Island, and also visit the plantations and mine sites to see for themselves.

By not having a hearing at Nguiu, we would be disadvantaged, and Traditional Owners will not be well heard.
