



Dodson to brief Committee on what works and what needs improving in Indigenous education

The Standing Committee on Indigenous Affairs is inquiring into what educational options have met with the most success for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students. We need to know what works best, what has failed and what we can do in conjunction with communities to improve Indigenous education.

Professor Mick Dodson, and Dr Bill Fogarty, from the National Centre for Indigenous Studies (NCIS) will brief the Committee on what is working in indigenous education and what needs to be improved or better supported. The public hearing will be held at Parliament House on **Wednesday 16 March, 5:30 – 6:30pm** in **Committee Room 1R3**.
