To the Senate,

I am writing in regard to the Senate inquiry into the Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Amendment Bill 2012.

It should be considered a priority to tighten the laws involved with the protection of our country's water sources. Water is a raw ingredient for life (including drinking, agriculture, economic production) and allowing any slack in regulations to protect these sources is unacceptable.
