New aircraft facilities proposed for RAAF Base Amberley Revised date for submissions

The Royal Australian Air Force (RAAF) operates eight <u>C-17A aircraft</u> from <u>Amberley</u>, Queensland. These heavy airlift aircraft provide capacity for deploying troops, vehicles and supplies rapidly anywhere in the world.

In their submission, the Department of Defence state that the existing C-17A aircraft maintenance and storage facilities are inefficient and no longer provide adequate support to operational activities. Subsequently, they are seeking approval to construct new facilities, including workshops and amenities, an aircraft apron, explosive ordnance facilities, refuelling stations and associated infrastructure such as roads and security services.

The works are expected to commence in early 2017 and be completed by late 2018. The estimated cost of the project is \$219.4 million (excluding GST).

The Committee Chair, Senator Dean Smith, said the Committee will conduct public and in-camera hearings for the inquiry in the near future.
