Subject: Misinformation Bill and Freedom of Expression

We write to you today with love and humility to address a matter of utmost importance: the proposed *Misinformation Bill 2024*. If this bill becomes law, the definitions outlined in the September 2024 version of the bill could lead to the removal of our content and accounts. - 2. **Condemnation of Political Censorship:** We categorically condemn the use of the Wakeley Stabbing incident to further any political censorship agenda. It is unfortunate that such events are exploited for political gain. As a religious institution, we believe in transparency and truth. The attempt to manipulate public discourse by using this incident is deeply troubling on the state of politics in Australia.
- 3. **Rejection of Misinformation Bills:** We reject any misinformation or online censorship bill proposed by government. Our faith teaches us to seek truth, and censorship should not be the solution. Instead, let us focus on the light through educating and empowering our communities to discern reliable information from falsehoods.

In conclusion, we urge lawmakers and citizens alike to consider the implications of the Misinformation Bill 2024. Let us protect our right to express our faith and engage in meaningful dialogue without fear of suppression. May the grace of our Lord guide us in these challenging times.
