OPENING STATEMENT

AT PUBLIC HEARING FOR SENATE INQUIRY ON AIRCRAFT NOISE 20th September 2024

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- 1. Good morning, Senators. Initially, I prepared a succinct summary of my submission and supplementary on ANEF (co- authored with Tony Williams). However, when I visited this place on Wednesday night, I had a lumen and decided to tell you a short story instead.
- 2. It's a story about the steady decline over forty years in scholarly research on aircraft noise in Australia. <u>Back in 1982</u>, Dr Rob Bullen and I published a report on the only national survey of community reaction to aircraft noise conducted in this country, namely, the <u>NAL</u> <u>Report</u>, (see 'Additional Document 12').
- 3. <u>In 1996</u>, the Government responded to the 'Falling on Deaf Ears' report by recommending some important research on aircraft noise. They did fund one major study on which I collaborated, but it was not about the important issues they mentioned.
- 4. <u>In 1998</u>, I was invited by the World Health Organisation to join their expert panel in London and collaborated on writing their revised *'Guidelines for Community Noise'*.
- 5. In 2014, the Sydney Airport Community Forum (SACF) invited me and Rob Bullen to assess the need for a new national survey. We recommended that a new survey was long-overdue. SACF actively promoted our recommendation, but it was mysteriously blocked (possibly by Airservices Australia and/or the Department). Ten years later, the Government has taken no action re a new survey.

- 6. <u>In 2018</u>, SACF invited me to advise on recent international research on aircraft noise and its implications for 'the NAL study and the ANEF system'. I advised that five reports were needed to address the relevant issues, and undertook to write the first two (see 'Additional Documents 23 and 24').
- 7. In 2024, I researched our submission on ANEF by conducting a literature review of the international research on aircraft noise over the past four years. In our supplementary, we report on a review we conducted of all mentions of ANEF, ANEC or ANEI in all the submissions to this Inquiry.
- 8. The moral of this story is that Australia has failed dismally to maintain its scholarly research on aircraft noise, and the Government urgently needs to commission the following studies:
 - 1) a new national survey around seven Australian airports including a regional and a general aviation airport;
 - 2) 'before-and-after' surveys of communities exposed to 'new noise', namely, at Western Sydney Airport due to open in 2026, and at Melbourne Airport when their recently-approved third runway opens.
- 9. Senators, I submit that such a research program is <u>essential</u> if this Inquiry is to be a catalyst for effective reforms on *the impact and mitigation of aircraft noise*.
