Thirdly, I lodged my application 886 with my auntie sponsors me, I have spent lots of time preparing for the application, to make sure that I can lodge my application straight after I graduate. I was extremely happy after the lodgement is successful, and now I am in the stage of seeking for a really good job while waiting for the permanent resident visa to be granted in 2 years. If the rule is changed, it should not be applied to people who have been lodged their application and have been waiting patiently for substantial periods of time already; because it is unethical and it is extremely not fair. I have not been noticed anything about this axing before, and I myself, my family, my lecturers in University, and all of my friends both in Australia and in my country are strongly against this unfair axing. Every international student chooses Australia as a country to come and study because of its fairness system and education. This unfair axing will definitely have extreme damage to Australia's international reputation; will strongly affect Australia's economy due to the definite decrease in the number of intelligent young people with high skills and strong passion of success. Now, I strongly advise the senate enquiry that this Migration Amendment should not be accepted due to its great negative influences to a large majority of people.
