# Answer

- 1. The Department worked closely with the Department of Health to negotiate the dose sharing arrangement and arrange delivery of the vaccines. The Department of Health is the contracting party for the Australian Government.
- 2. 18 August
- 3. Singapore first proposed the dose sharing arrangement to Australia.
- 4. Under the swap arrangement, Australia will supply 500,000 Pfizer doses to Singapore in December.

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- 5. The Department worked closely with the Department of Health to negotiate the dose sharing arrangement and arrange delivery of the vaccines. The Department of Health is the contracting party for the Australian Government.
- 6. 19 August
- 7. Australia first proposed the dose sharing arrangement to the UK.
- 8. Under the swap arrangement, Australia will send four million Pfizer doses to the UK from Australian supplies in late 2021.
