I too contracted Hepatitis C. I underwent a successful interferon treatment in the early 1990s. I was one of the lucky ones; having only a 1 in 5 chance of success with the treatment which had significant side-effects.

John has kept me up to date regarding progress in the treatment of this disease; including successful trial in the USA of new drug therapies.
