



Home ownership hearings kick-off in Canberra

The House of Representatives Economics Committee will conduct its first public hearing for the inquiry on home ownership in Canberra on Friday 26 June 2015. In this inquiry, the committee will examine:

- current rates of home ownership;
- demand and supply drivers in the housing market;
- the proportion of investment housing relative to owner-occupied housing;
- the impact of current tax policy at all levels; and
- opportunities for reform.

The Chair of the Committee, John Alexander said that 'home ownership is an issue that affects us all and there are many Australians who are now struggling to buy a first home, particularly in our major cities. The committee wishes to examine whether the current policy settings are optimal to ensure that all Australians have a fair chance to own their own home.'

At this first public hearing, the committee will hear evidence from four key Commonwealth agencies.
