**Ms O'Neil:** I would have to take that on notice. I can't recall precisely. We did receive some consultation on the draft, but, as to the exact time we had, I would have to take it on notice. I don't know off the top of my head.

- SBS received an exposure draft of the Bill on 10 October 2017, requesting feedback on 16 October. SBS provided feedback on 19 October.
- DOCA provided a further draft of the Bill on 14 November 2017, requesting feedback by Friday 17 November 2017.
- SBS provided feedback on this draft of the Bill on 17 November 2017.

- You said you had some consultation. When was that?

**Senator URQUHART:** You said you had some consultation. When was that?

**Ms O'Neil:** I think it would have been towards the end of last year—yes, the end of last year—but I would have to take that on notice too to be precise. I wouldn't want to mislead the committee by guessing.
